

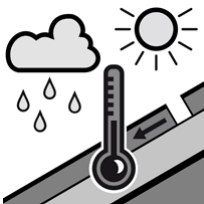

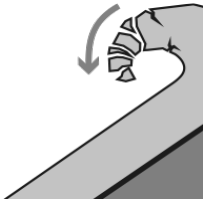

Wind Slab



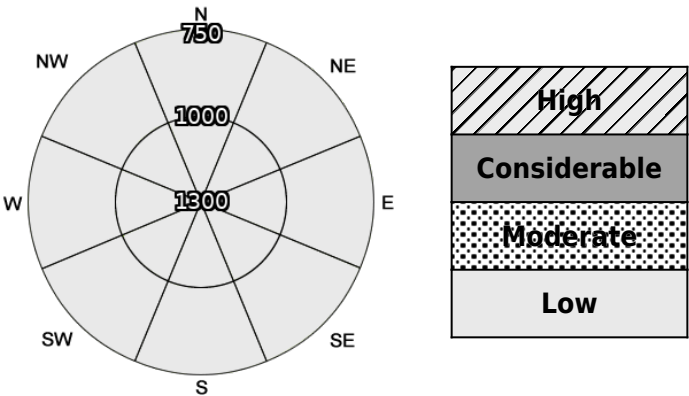
Wet Snow

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The old snowpack will begin to firm up during the afternoon and remain well bonded and stable throughout. Isolated accumulations of windslab will develop on North to East aspects above 900 metres. These will be mainly shallow, avoidable and in wind sheltered locations. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Mainly dry before the arrival of light precipitation during the afternoon, this will fall as snow initially at summit levels then to above 800 metres as the freezing level falls to this level towards the end of the day. South-West to West-South-Westerly winds will be gale to storm force.

Comments

As it turns cooler the snowpack will firm up, steep slopes will have serious run out potential into rocks below.
