


## THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE LOW

#### Avalanche Problems




Wind Slab

#### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The old exposed patchy snowpack will refreeze and be firm and well stabilised. New moist windslab will begin to form on steep very sheltered North to East aspects above 1000m. New accumulations not expected to be extensive and will be confined to the top of coire rims and gully tops. Some minor new cornice development over lee slopes but only very late in the period. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



#### Forecast Weather Influences

Some overnight rainfall at all levels then dry and cooler. Some sleety snowfall during the morning extending into the afternoon. Strong West-South-West winds.

#### Comments

Some windslab developing late in the period above 1000m but not expected to be deep or extensive.
