

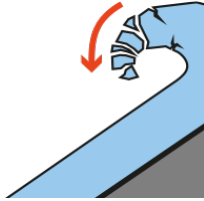

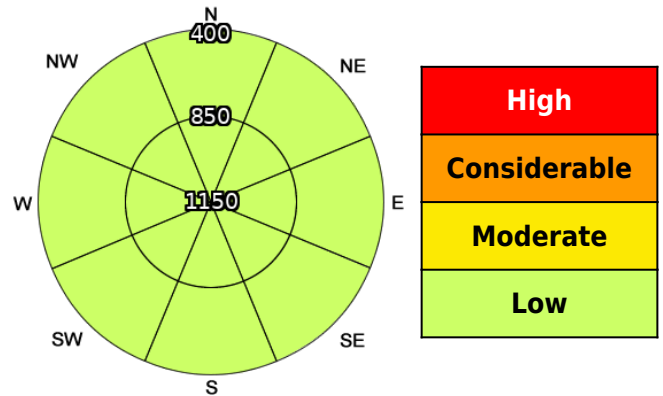
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

There will be a covering of soft, generally stable snow on most aspects above 400 metres. Unstable windslab will continue to form in wind sheltered locations mainly on North-East to South-East aspects above 850 metres. These accumulations will be localised, mainly in steeper locations, gullies, gully tops and coire rims. North and South aspects may also be affected due to cross-loading. Areas exposed to the wind will become scoured. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Light snow showers overnight with strong Westerly winds easing. During the day it's expected to be dry. The freezing level will remain around 200 metres throughout.

Comments

Greater amounts of snow, up to 5cm, are possible if the snow showers overnight are more persistent. If this proves to be the case adjust the hazard upwards. Cornices will continue to form.
