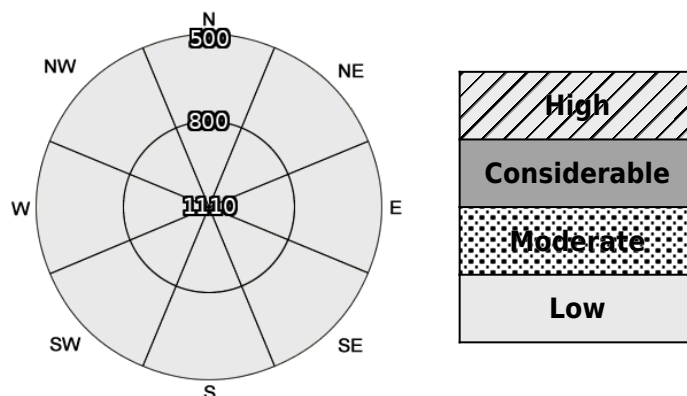


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE LOW**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 06/02/2025****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

There will be a shallow covering of fresh snow on most aspects above 500 metres. Weaknesses will exist in isolated pockets of wind slab that have accumulated in steep wind sheltered locations, North to East aspects, generally above 800 metres, where it will mostly be shallow and limited in extent. The old snow will remain refrozen and firm. Wind exposed terrain will be scoured. The avalanche hazard will be Low.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

It will be a largely dry day with good periods of sunshine. The wind will remain strong throughout, initially South-Westerly, slowly backing Southerly. The freezing level will lower overnight to around 700 metres during the day.

Comments

High pressure will bring largely dry conditions over the next few days. Expect some sunshine! The winds will remain strong initially with a respectable windchill at summit levels.
