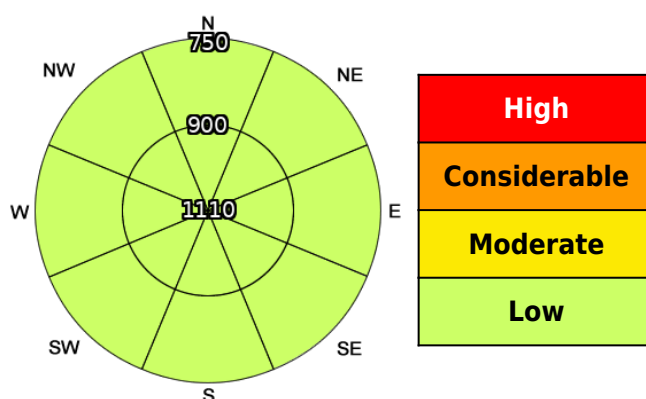


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE LOW**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 10/02/2025****Avalanche Problems****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Little change is expected. The remaining snow patches will continue to consolidate and be well bonded and stable throughout. Snow cover will remain patchy and mainly confined to steep North through East to South-East aspects above 750m. Sun affected aspects may soften slightly, otherwise the snow patches will remain firm. The avalanche hazard will be Low.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Fresh Easterly winds overnight, increasing to very strong by mid-morning. A clear, dry and sunny day is forecast. A fluctuating freezing level reflecting the influence of high pressure. However, it is expected that the ground will remain frozen above 400 meters.

Comments

Another bright, clear and sunny day in the Western Torridon area. Further East, temperature inversion cloud was present. A hard frost in the glen this morning soon cleared in sun affected areas. Remaining snow patches are very firm, particularly in the shade with serious and consequential runouts. More of the same expected tomorrow as the high pressure continues.
