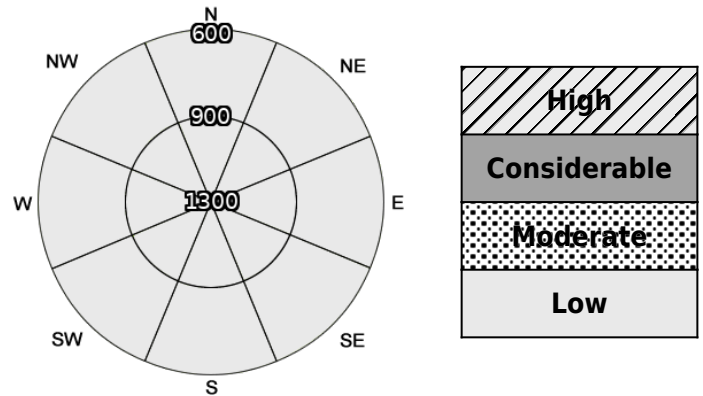
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Isolated, shallow poorly bonded windslab will persist on North-West though North to East aspects above 1000 metres. These will be limited in extent and generally avoidable. Areas most affected will be around coire rims, convexities and gully tops. Elsewhere the snowpack will remain firm, icy and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

It is expected to be dry throughout the forecast period. Fresh East-South-Easterly winds will increase to strong during the day and back to become Easterly. The 700 metre freezing level will fall to 500 metres by dawn, and remain there for the duration of the day.
