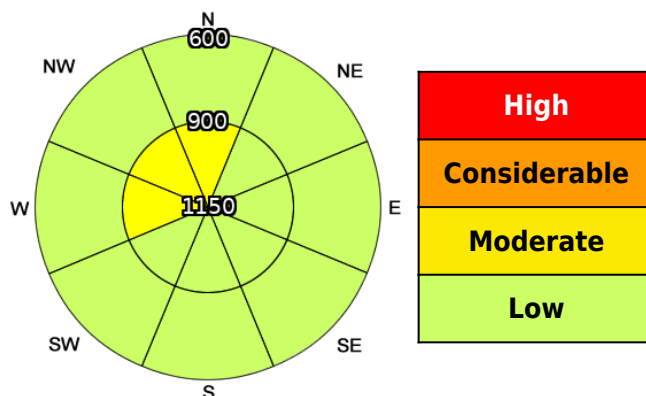

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Instabilities within the snowpack will persist on West and North-West aspects above 900 metres. Localised areas of unstable windslab will develop through the forecast period on mainly North aspects also above 900 metres. Areas most affected will be steep wind sheltered locations such as gully tops and coire rims. Cornices will be found on West to North aspects. The old snow will be icy, hard with good stability. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

A dry day is expected with the exception of some light snowfall during the afternoon. It will remain cold with the freezing level around 200 metres, rising to 400 metres in the afternoon. Winds will be fresh from the South-South-East with a lull for a few hours in the early hours before backing East and becoming fresh once again.

Comments

Expect the redistribution of existing unconsolidated snow from mid mountain level through the forecast period. Significant snowfall expected on Sunday.
