

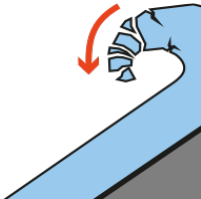

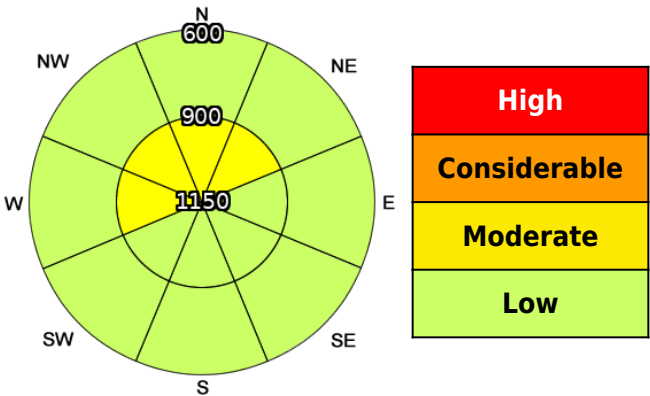
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will continue to build on West through North to North-East aspects above 900 metres. Steep wind sheltered locations such as coire rims, gully tops and convexities will be mostly affected. Fragile cornices will be present above these aspects. Elsewhere the snowpack will be generally well bonded with shallow snow combined with isolated drifts at lower elevations. Slopes exposed to the wind will become scoured. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Precipitation is expected to fall as snow above 300 metres throughout the period. Winds will be strong to very strong and predominately from the South-South-East. The freezing level will be around 400 metres, rising slightly by the end of the day.

Comments

Caution required in deeper fresh windslab, unstable deposits continue to become more extensive particularly close to coire rims.
