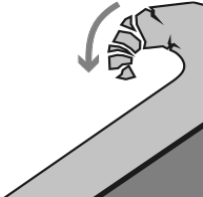

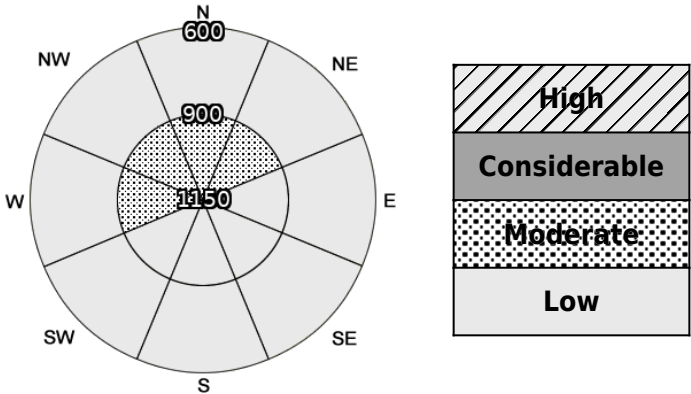

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will continue to build, before developing further instabilities as the snowpack becomes moist. Areas most affected will be steep wind sheltered locations of West through North to North-East aspects above 900 metres, such as coire rims, gully tops and convexities. Fragile cornices will be prone to collapse. Elsewhere the snowpack will be well bonded and stable, slowly reducing in depth and extent. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Dry conditions are expected with very strong to gale force winds from the South-East. The freezing level will rise from 400 metres overnight to 1000-1200 metres by the end of the period.

Comments

There is some uncertainty in the timing of the expected temperature rise. Observations during the day will help to identify the timing of any wet snow instability.
