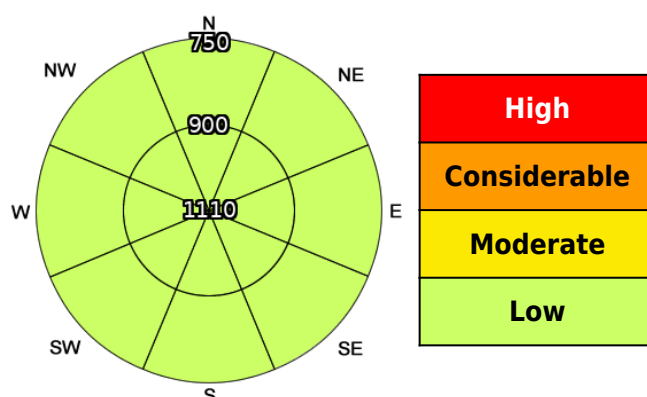


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE LOW**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Wednesday 19/02/2025****Avalanche Problems****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Any remaining fresh snow will continue to slowly thaw leaving behind the old existing snowpack. This will gradually soften during the day, but will be stable and well bonded throughout. Greatest accumulations will be found on North to East aspects above 750 metres especially around coire rims, gully tops and high inland coires. The avalanche hazard will be Low.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Mainly dry with the freezing level above the summits. Winds will increase in strength to become very strong by midday fluctuating from the South-East or East-South-East.

Comments

Winds expected to be reach gale force in strength for inland ranges. Icy sections still remain. Risk of falling ice and rock continues to be a threat from above during the thaw cycle.
