

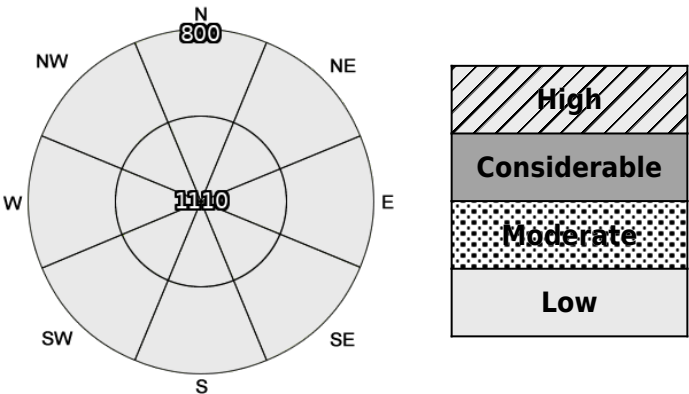

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Friday 21/02/2025

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The existing snowpack will continue to diminish and thaw in all locations. Patchy in nature, the moist snowpack will be stable and well bonded throughout. Greatest amounts will be found mainly around coire rims, ridge flanks, in deep wind sheltered locations and coire headwalls on North to East aspects above 800 metres. Inland ranges retaining greatest amounts of snow. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Freezing levels remaining above the summits, spiking around 2000 metres at midday before lowering to 1200 metres. Heavy and persistent rain expected, especially during daylight hours. Storm force summit winds from the Southern quadrant.

Comments

The remaining snowpack will continue to disappear in the wet and warm conditions. Residual ice fall and rockfall will continue to be a hazard during the thaw.
