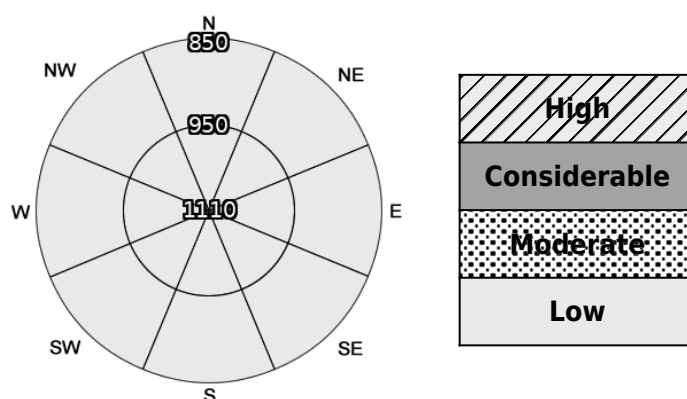


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE LOW**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 06/03/2025****Avalanche Problems****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

The remnants of snow remaining, on North to East aspects above 900 metres, will continue to thaw and diminish, and will remain stable and well bonded. These scattered patches will only be encountered at the highest elevations on Coire rims and gully tops. In general the hills are largely snow free. The avalanche hazard will be Low.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Overnight heavy rain, to all levels, will ease by Thursday morning. Then, through the day on Thursday it will be largely dry and cloudy. Winds will remain South-South-Westerly Gale force on the tops. Although the freezing level will lower slightly, it will remain well above the summits throughout the period.

Comments

There has been significant snow loss over the last 24 hours of the already patchy snowpack. This will continue, and, as stated yesterday, there will be little if any snow left in the Torridon forecast area.

Looking ahead, Friday is generally settled but remains warm, the weekend is mixed, with the best weather most likely on Sunday. It does look like we will return to colder conditions on the hills early next week.
