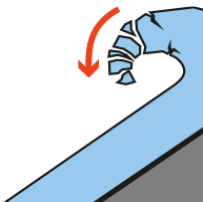

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Friday 21/03/2025

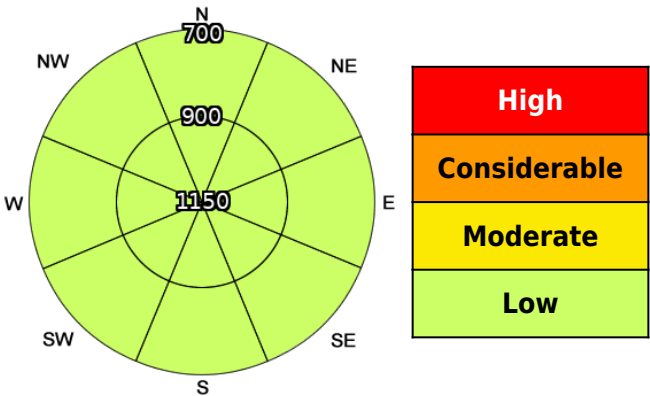
Avalanche Problems



Cornices

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will be generally well bonded and stable. Older snow will remain firm and icy and be present mainly in steeper locations on North-West to North-East aspects above 900 metres. Old residual cornices will become unstable, mainly on South-West to South-East aspects above 1100 metres in the remote Northerly coires of the area. Elsewhere, the patchy snowpack will continue to slowly consolidate. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Moderate to fresh South-Easterly winds will steadily increase in strength, becoming very strong to gale force through the day. Clear skies in the evening will give way to cloud for the remainder of the period. The freezing level will be above the summits.

Comments

Firm snow ice continues to present a slip hazard to the unwary.
