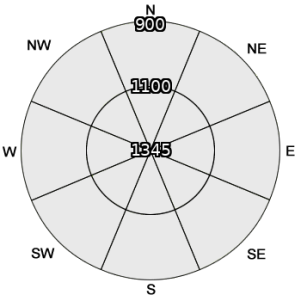


Avalanche Hazard Forecast - FOR PERIOD 18:00HRS Wed 02/04/2025 TO 18:00HRS Thu 03/04/2025



Hazard Level	Avalanche Probability
Very High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. Numerous very large, often extremely large natural avalanches can be expected.
High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. In some cases, numerous large, often very large sized natural avalanches can be expected.
Considerable	Natural and human triggered avalanches possible, in some cases large, in isolated cases very large sized natural avalanches are possible.
Moderate	Very large sized natural avalanches are unlikely. Human triggering possible in indicated steep places.
Low	Only small and medium sized natural avalanches are possible. Human triggering possible in steep, extreme terrain.

Forecast Weather Influences

Another mild sunny day with fresh East-South-Easterly winds. The freezing level will be above the summits.

Forecast Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will continue to gradually thaw and diminish. Stability will be generally good, however isolated wet snow surface instabilities possible on steep slopes exposed to the sun. The avalanche hazard will be Low.

Observed Avalanche Hazard - Wed 02/04/2025

Observed Weather Influences

A mild and sunny day with fresh South-Easterly winds.

Observed Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

The remaining snow continues to thaw and diminish. Stability is generally good. Any isolated small sections of cornice that remain are prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard is Low.

Mountain Conditions

Observed Mountain Travel Conditions	Sparse snow cover, most snow remains N to E slopes above 1100m. Sunny clear conditions. Winds 20 -30 mph.
Comments	Greatest areas remain in North to East facing corries and gullies above 1100 metres, very limited snow elsewhere. Fine sunny weather set to continue.
