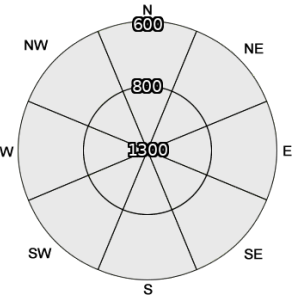


Avalanche Hazard Forecast - FOR PERIOD 18:00HRS Sat 29/11/2025 TO 18:00HRS Sun 30/11/2025



Hazard Level	Avalanche Probability
Very High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. Numerous very large, often extremely large natural avalanches can be expected.
High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. In some cases, numerous large, often very large sized natural avalanches can be expected.
Considerable	Natural and human triggered avalanches possible, in some cases large, in isolated cases very large sized natural avalanches are possible.
Moderate	Very large sized natural avalanches are unlikely. Human triggering possible in indicated steep places.
Low	Only small and medium sized natural avalanches are possible. Human triggering possible in steep, extreme terrain.

Forecast Weather Influences

Moderate North-West winds will ease during the day then back to strong Southerly by the evening. Scattered showers at first, these becoming lighter and more isolated through the morning. Dry with clear spells through the middle of the day into early evening. The freezing level will be around 300 metres.

Forecast Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

The old patchy snow pack will be firm and stable throughout. Greatest accumulations are found above 800 meters on many aspects. Isolated shallow accumulations of soft snow are found mainly on Southerly aspects above 800m and will drift onto Northerly aspects later in the day as the wind backs to South. These are not expected to achieve significant depth. The avalanche hazard will be Low.

Observed Avalanche Hazard - Sat 29/11/2025

Observed Weather Influences

Isolated showers during the evening gave way to a mostly dry night and day. The freezing level was around 600 metres. Moderate Northerly winds.

Observed Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

The snow pack is generally well bonded icy and stable. There has been a light dusting of new snow above 600 metres. The snow cover is patchy with the greatest amounts found above 800 metres on many aspects. The avalanche hazard is Low.

Mountain Conditions

Observed Mountain Travel Conditions	Very hard snow ice on patchy snow slopes. Cloudy on the tops with some bright spells. Winds approx 20 mph or less.
Comments	Icy snow pack with unfavourable runouts.
