
Avalanche Hazard Forecast - FOR PERIOD 18:00HRS Wed 03/12/2025 TO 18:00HRS Thu 04/12/2025



Hazard Level	Avalanche Probabilty
Very High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. Numerous very large, often extremely large natural avalanches can be expected.
High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. In some cases, numerous large, often very large sized natural avalanches can be expected.
Considerable	Natural and human triggered avalanches possible, in some cases large, in isolated cases very large sized natural avalanches are possible.
Moderate	Very large sized natural avalanches are unlikely. Human triggering possible in indicated steep places.
Low	Only small and medium sized natural avalanches are possible. Human triggering possible in steep, extreme terrain.

Forecast Weather Influences

Gale Force South-Easterly winds. Showers falling as snow on the higher tops. The freezing level will be around 1000 meters.

Forecast Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

Fresh deposits of moderately bonded windslab will continue to accumulate on North-West through North to East facing aspects above 1050 meters. These instabilities are expected to be localised affecting wind sheltered locations such as gully tops and corrie headwalls. On other aspects and at lower elevations, the snowpack is generally stable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

Observed Avalanche Hazard - Wed 03/12/2025

Observed Weather Influences

Very Strong Southerly winds. Frequent showers falling as snow above around 1000 meters. The freezing level rose to around 1000 meters.

Observed Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

Moderately bonded windslab was present on North-West through North to North-East aspects above 1050 meters. Areas mainly affected were steep wind sheltered locations such as gully tops and corrie rims. Small cornices also noted above these aspects. On other aspects and at lower elevations the snowpack is generally stable. The avalanche hazard is Moderate.

Mountain Conditions

Observed Mountain Travel Conditions	No snow below 900m but with some drifting at higher altitudes. Cloudy on the tops. Winds 20 -30 mph progress difficult at times with stronger gusts.
Comments	The snow line rose today with frequent showers falling as rain below around 1000m. A similar day is expected tomorrow.
