
Avalanche Hazard Forecast - FOR PERIOD 18:00HRS Thu 04/12/2025 TO 18:00HRS Fri 05/12/2025



Hazard Level	Avalanche Probabilty
Very High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. Numerous very large, often extremely large natural avalanches can be expected.
High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. In some cases, numerous large, often very large sized natural avalanches can be expected.
Considerable	Natural and human triggered avalanches possible, in some cases large, in isolated cases very large sized natural avalanches are possible.
Moderate:	Very large sized natural avalanches are unlikely. Human triggering possible in indicated steep places.
Low	Only small and medium sized natural avalanches are possible. Human triggering possible in steep, extreme terrain.

Forecast Weather Influences

Gale force South-Easterly winds increasing to Storm force during the afternoon. Frequent showers falling as snow on the highest tops. The freezing level is expected to be around 1050 meters.

Forecast Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

Fresh deposits of moderately bonded windslab will continue to accumulate on North-West through North to East aspects above 1100 meters. These instabilities are expected to be localised affecting wind sheltered locations such as gully tops and corrie headwalls. Cornices will continue to develop above these aspects. On other aspects and at lower elevations, the snowpack will remain generally stable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

Observed Avalanche Hazard - Thu 04/12/2025

Observed Weather Influences

Strong South-Easterly winds. Light showers falling as snow on summit plateau. The freezing level was around 1100 meters.

Observed Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

Fresh deposits of moderately bonded windslab are present on North-West through North to East aspects above 1100 meters. These instabilities are localised affecting wind sheltered locations such as gully tops and corrie headwalls. Fragile cornices continued to build on these same aspects. On other aspects and at lower elevations, the snowpack is generally stable. The avalanche hazard is Moderate.

Mountain Conditions

Observed Mountain Travel Conditions	Wet snow below 1100m, drifting above. Whiteout conditions presenting challenging navigation and serious travel conditions above 900m. Winds 20-30 mph progress difficult at times with stronger gusts.
Comments	A lot of fresh snow overnight. Snow level around 950m, damp snow up to 1100m, dry drifting snow above. Very wintry on the tops. Expect more of the same tomorrow with much stronger winds.
