





Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The remaining wet snow will refreeze in the colder conditions. New unstable windslab will be deposited in wind sheltered locations, mainly on North-West through North to East aspects above 900 metres. Areas gaining depth are not expected to be extensive. Cornices will start to build above these aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Very strong South-South-Westerly winds will back South-South-Easterly during the day. Overnight showers will fall as snow mainly above 800 metres, dwindling during the morning before returning through the afternoon. This evening and overnight the freezing level will lower to around 800 metres.

Comments

There is the possibility of persistent snow later in the day. If this happens adjust the hazard accordingly.
