




Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Wednesday 24/12/2025

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Remaining snow will be well bonded and stable, becoming very firm above 850 metres due to the settled conditions. Greatest amounts of snow will be present in locations such as gully tops and coire rims of a North to East aspect above 950 metres. Elsewhere, isolated snow patches will remain in depressions in plateau areas. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

No significant precipitation is expected as a dry and settled airmass becomes established. Winds will be from the South-East veering to the South during daylight hours and will be moderate to fresh in strength. The ground will be zero degrees Celsius from around 850 metres upwards as high pressure starts to dominate.

Comments

The snow surface is expected to become very firm tomorrow as a stable airmass becomes established.
