

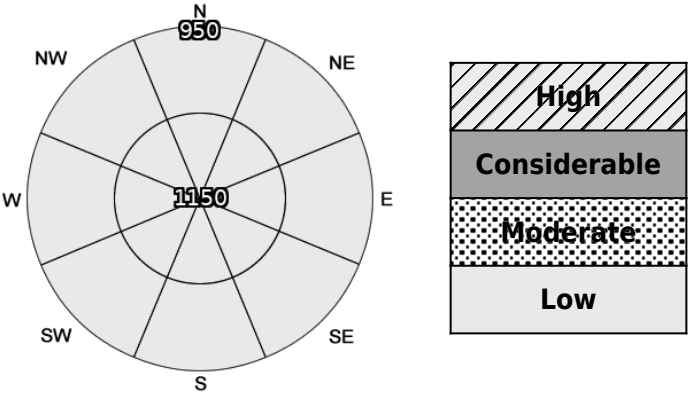

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 29/12/2025

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Little change, the remaining patchy snowpack will remain frozen, well bonded, firm and stable, the greatest areas will be above 950 metres. These patchy accumulations will mainly exist in sheltered gullies and hollows on North to East aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

High pressure will continue to affect the area, it is expected to remain cold and dry throughout the period. The light variable winds will slowly strengthen becoming moderate to fresh Easterly at first then North-Easterly through the day. The freezing level will lower to around 750 metres by the end on the day.

Comments

Staying dry through till Tuesday evening some change is expected during Wednesday with a North-Westerly flow developing bringing more showery conditions.
