




**Avalanche Hazard Forecast**

New unstable windslab will be deposited in wind sheltered areas, mainly on East through South to South-West aspects above 700 metres, where avalanches are likely. Fragile cornices will continue to build above these aspects. Weaknesses will persist in the recently deposited windslab lying mainly on North through East to South-East aspects above 700 metres. Weaknesses will also remain in deeper deposits of windslab at lower levels. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Winds will be mainly North-North-Westerly, gale force overnight then gradually easing through the day. Overnight the freezing level will drop from 500 metres to be around 300 metres through the day. Precipitation is expected throughout the period, initially falling as snow above 400 metres, then above 200 metres.

**Comments**

Unstable windslab continues to be deposited in wind sheltered areas, and accumulations are becoming deeper and more widespread.
