




**Avalanche Hazard Forecast**

Unstable windslab will initially be present mainly on North to East aspects above 900 metres. Overnight, redistribution and further snowfall will develop further areas of unstable windslab on South-East and South aspects with some scouring of Northerly aspects. Fragile cornices will be present above all these aspects. Localised areas of windslab will also be present on other aspects and at lower elevations. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Showers overnight will fall as snow to low levels. The day will then be mostly dry. Very strong North-North-West winds overnight ease through the day. The freezing level will drop to around 200 metres.
