

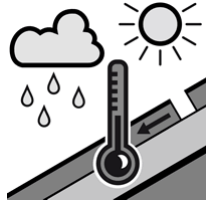

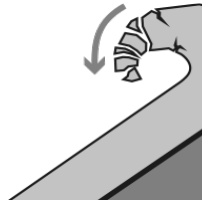

Wind Slab



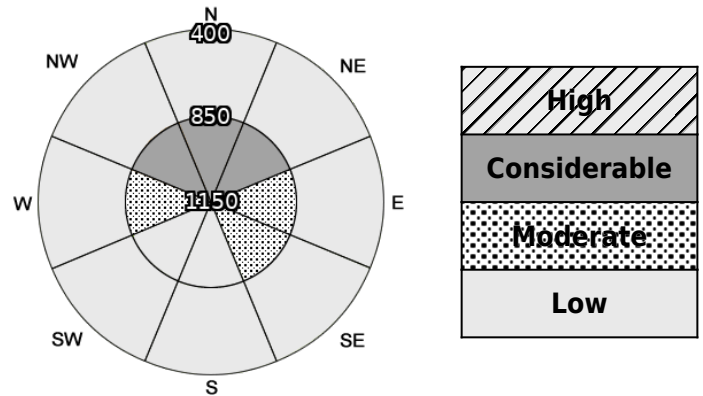

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New snow and wind transport of existing snow later on Saturday and overnight will initially form deep accumulations of unstable windslab mainly above 850 metres in sheltered areas such as gullies and on slopes with a West through North to Easterly aspect. Mild and wet conditions through Sunday will saturate the snowpack developing wet snow instabilities. Avalanches and cornice collapse are likely. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

New snow overnight will affect the area giving between 10 and 20 cm of accumulation, mid morning, precipitation will turn to heavy rain at all levels as the freezing level rises to 2000 metres. Winds will be generally South-South-Easterly strong to gale force.
