
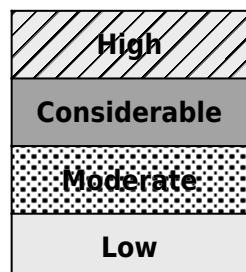



Avalanche Hazard Forecast

THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE LOW**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 12/01/2026****Avalanche Problems****Wet Snow****Cornices****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

The snowpack will continue to thaw and consolidate, stability will be generally good. Minor surface instabilities possible on steep slopes on all aspects above 700 metres particularly in the event of cornice collapse. Any new snow deposits on the highest summits are not expected to be significant. The avalanche hazard will be Low.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Precipitation will be heaviest overnight becoming more showery during the day and fall as rain at most levels with wet summit snow possible. Storm force South-Westerly winds easing slightly during the day.

Thaw conditions through Monday before the freezing level falls again on Tuesday.
