



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The existing snowpack will start to re-freeze improving general stability, localised accumulations of unstable windslab will form in areas such as sheltered gullies and on slopes with a North-West through North to Easterly aspect mainly above 850 metres, these accumulations are not expected to be deep or extensive and should in the main be avoidable, Fragile cornices may form above these aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Low

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Becoming colder, the freezing level will lower to around 600 metres through the course of the morning. Snow showers overnight and on Tuesday and moderate to fresh generally South-Westerly winds will affect the area. Snow accumulation is not expected to be great with 1-2 cm expected perhaps 5 in places.

Comments

Cooler and less windy outlook. New snow amounts are not expected to be great, prepare to alter plans if greater volumes of snow arrive.
