

Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The old snowpack will remain firm well bonded and stable throughout. Accumulations of unstable windslab will develop on North-West through North to South-East aspects above 900 metres. These will be mostly isolated and confined to coire rims, gully tops and steep rollovers. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Very occasional light snowfall. Westerly winds will be strong gusting gale force over the summits, backing South-West to become Southerly later. The 500 metre freezing level will rise to 800 metres during the day then to 1000 metres later in the afternoon.

Comments

Only very light snowfall expected over the next 24 hours.
