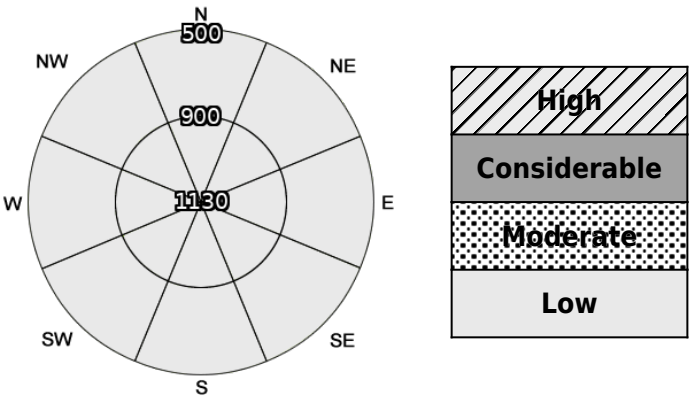
Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The current diminished and patchy snowpack lying on most aspects above 600m will continue to refreeze and stabilise. Some additional new snow will form shallow avoidable windslab deposits in wind sheltered locations on North -West through North to Easterly aspects above mostly 900m. Coire rims and gully tops mostly affected. The avalanche hazard will be Low



Forecast Weather Influences

Winds, strong Westerly overnight backing gale force Southerly during the afternoon. Freezing level 400m overnight rising to around 700m by daybreak and for the rest of the period. Precipitation will be light snowfall overnight mostly dry with the odd snow shower during the day.

Comments

Deep breakable crusty snow which hopefully should become firmer in the colder conditions.
