



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Stable conditions so again little change is expected. Deposits of unstable windslab will persist in steep wind sheltered locations on mainly North-West through North to East aspects above 950 metres. Greatest accumulations will be around coire rims, gully tops, ridge flanks and in sheltered hollows. Cornices will also be fragile on these aspects. Elsewhere the snowpack will continue to consolidate and be generally stable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

The freezing level will be around 1000 metres during Sunday night gradually rising to be above the summits by the end the period. Mainly dry with patchy clouds, winds will be moderate to fresh from a South-Easterly direction.

Comments

The snowpack continues to consolidate in the Southerly air-stream.
