




Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will be present on North-West to North-East aspects above 900 metres. Steep wind sheltered locations such as coire rims and gully exits and will be especially affected. Fragile cornices will overhang these aspects. Elsewhere the snowpack will be mostly well bonded and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Light snow fall during the evening above around 900 metres will clear to become dry and mostly sunny during the day. Continuing strong South-South-Easterly winds. The freezing level will rise above the summits during the day though much terrain will remain frozen above 600 metres.

Comments

Icy conditions remain on some of the lower mountain paths.
