





Wind Slab



Cornices

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Moderately to weakly bonded windslab in wind sheltered locations on West to North aspects above 900 metres. Moderately bonded accumulations below this altitude and on South-West aspects and a few North-East aspects. Fragile cornices present. Wet snow surfaces starting to refreeze above 600 metres. Wind exposed slopes will be scoured and icy. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Light, occasionally moderate snowfall, throughout the period. Strong East-South-Easterly winds overnight, veering South-Easterly by daylight and increasing to gale force by late afternoon. 600 metre freezing level.

Comments

Poor visibility making it hard to see large drifts and wind features. Difficult underfoot conditions. Bullet hard ice on wind scoured slopes.
