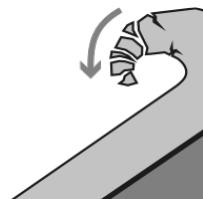



There will be a lot of snow blowing around in the strong winds. Areas of fresh unstable windslab will be deposited above 800 metres in sheltered locations on mainly West to North aspects where avalanches are likely. However, exposed windward aspects will tend to be scoured and stable. Fresh cornices will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable

**Forecast Weather Influences**

After some overnight snow showers a period of persistent snow is expected through the day. The freezing level will be around 600 metres. Storm force winds will be from the South-East.
