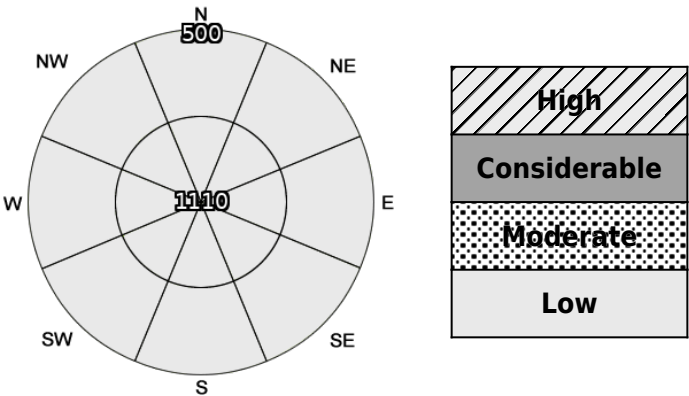
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Shallow accumulations of windslab will build on West to North aspects above 600 meters. These are expected to be shallow, isolated and easily avoidable. Patchy snow cover will remain on most aspects above 500 meters, becoming progressively more firm and extensive with height. The existing snowpack will continue to consolidate. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Storm force East-South-East winds backing Easterly and increasing during the day. Very light overnight snow showers forecast. The freezing level is expected to be around 600 meters.

Comments

Storm Chandra incoming, bringing 80 mph gusts to the Torridon region. Summit snow fields hard and icy. Full winter kit advised.
