

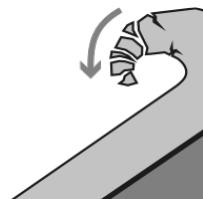



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Poorly bonded windslab will be deep and extensive on South-West through West to Northerly aspects mainly above 850m where avalanches are likely. Localised accumulations above 700m in wind sheltered places. Coire rims, headwalls and gully tops especially affected. Weak cornices will overhang all same aspects with collapse possible onto slopes below. Good stability on wind exposed NE to SE aspects where firm or crusty snow ice is widespread above 700m. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Generally, South-Easterly winds will continue, gale to storm force overnight easing in the day to fresh. Heavy snow will continue Tuesday evening then it is expected to be a mostly dry day. Freezing level around 800m.

Comments

A very stormy day, cold with snow above 500m. Winds easing during Wednesday but instabilities will still persist.
