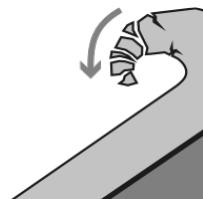


Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

On all but the highest summits above 950 metres the snowpack will continue to consolidate and be generally stable. Specific areas of unstable windslab will be present above 1000 metres in steep locations on mainly West through North to North-East aspects, gullies, gully tops, ridge flanks, and sheltered hollows most affected. Any cornices will be fragile. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

Forecast Weather Influences

Remaining mainly dry though the period with the freezing level around 1000 metres this evening slowly decreasing to around 700 metres by morning. A South-Easterly airflow with moderate to fresh winds increasing through the day.
