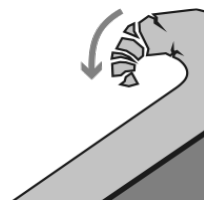
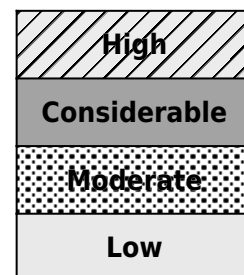
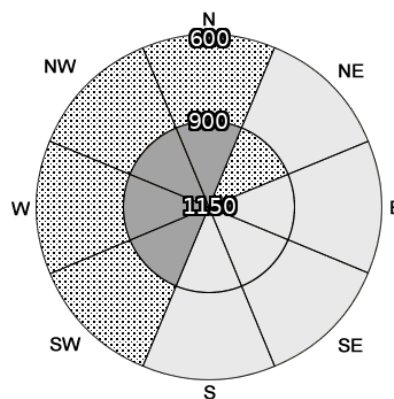


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE CONSIDERABLE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Wednesday 04/02/2026****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Cornices****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Fresh deposits of unstable windslab will be present in wind sheltered locations on South-West through West to North aspects above 900 metres. The greatest instability will be in steep locations such as coire headwalls, gullies and convex shaped terrain. Unstable cornices will overhang these aspects. Between 600 and 900 metres, localised instabilities will be present on steep banks and burn lines. Wind exposed slopes will be firm. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

The strong East-South-Easterly airflow will continue through the period, increasing to very strong for a time during early morning. This will bring continuous outbreaks of snow, with sleet and snow initially 200m and above. The freezing level will gradually rise to around 600 metres by the end of the day.
