






Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Windslab will continue to develop with avalanches likely on West to North aspects above 800 metres. The greatest instability will be in steep locations such as gullies, corrie head walls and convexities. Cross loading will affect South-West and North-East aspects. Fragile cornices will continue to develop on the same aspects. Between 500 and 800 meters, moderately bonded windslab will continue to develop on steep banks, convexities and burn lines. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Snowfall from the middle of the night onwards on gale force South-East becoming East-South-Easterly winds. During the night the freezing level will rise to 900 metres for a few hours before gradually falling to 500 metres by the end of the day.

Comments

Little change expected over the next 24 hours with continual drifting on the South-Easterly airflow.
