






Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Moderately to weakly bonded windslab will continue to form in wind sheltered locations on West to North aspects above 900 metres with avalanches likely. Windslab will also develop below this altitude as the freezing level lowers during the day. Cross-loaded deposits will be present on South-West and North-East aspects. Fragile cornices will form. Slopes exposed to the wind will be scoured and icy. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Snowfall arriving late evening, initially above 900 metres, eventually falling as snow to around 500 metres. Strong South-Easterly winds overnight, backing East-South-Easterly by daylight. Freezing level rising to 900 metres for a couple of hours around midnight, lowering to 500 metres by the end of the afternoon.

Comments

Expect difficult mountain conditions during Thursday.
