

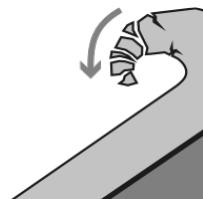



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Fresh moderately bonded windslab will develop as the day progresses on West through North-West to North-East aspects above 1000 metres. This will be limited in extent, presenting in areas such as coire rims and gully tops. The existing snowpack will be subject to slow consolidation, but continues to present lingering weakness at depth in terrain such as coire headwalls. Lower elevations will be subject to slow thaw. Remaining cornices will be weak. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Snow showers are expected above 1000 metres throughout the forecast period. Winds will generally be strong South-South-Easterlies overnight, decreasing to become fresh later. The freezing level will be around 1100 metres.

Comments

Slow consolidation of the snowpack is expected as the freezing level drops slightly. Some limited windslab development is anticipated as snow showers penetrate the Cairngorms from the South-East.
