

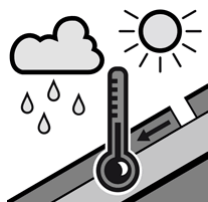

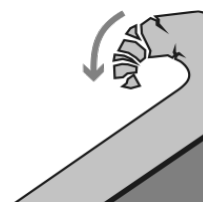

Wind Slab



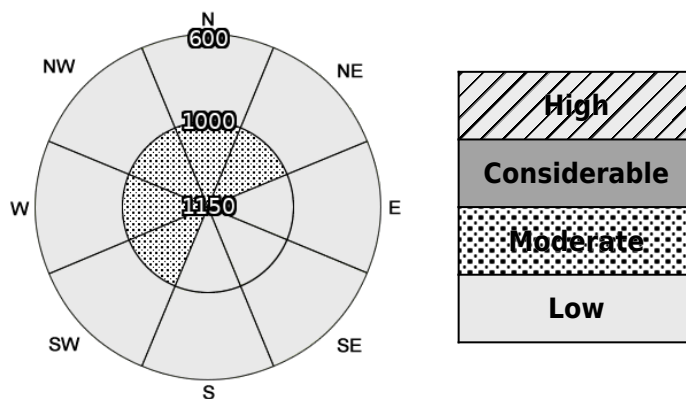

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Wet snow instabilities will continue to be present on steep South-West through West to North-East aspects, mainly between 600 and 1000 metres. Above this altitude fresh snow deposits are not expected to be significant. The old windslab continues to slowly consolidate but moderately bonded layers linger at depth above 1000 metres on the same aspects. Cornices will be weak and prone to collapse. Elsewhere stability will be generally good. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Fresh South-South-East winds will back South-Easterly overnight. Outbreaks of rain, falling as sleet and snow above 1000 metres. The Freezing level will be around 1000 metres.
