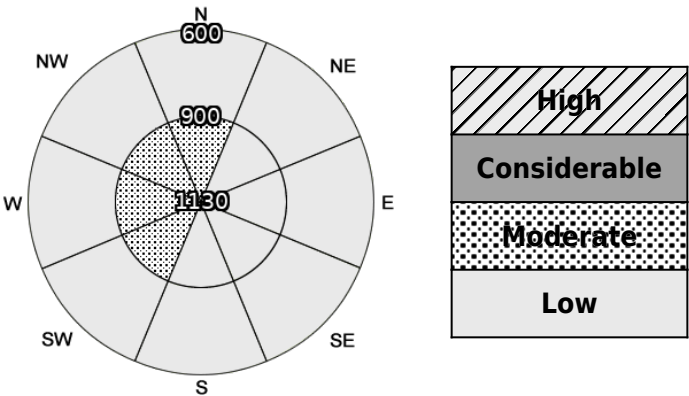

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Fresh deposits of unstable windslab will progressively build on South-West through West to North aspects above 900 metres. Wind-sheltered terrain such as coire rims and gully tops will be most affected. Cornices will build above the same aspects. Outwith these areas, stability will be good. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

The 900 metre freezing level will drop steadily to reach 600 metres by the end of the forecasting period. Precipitation expected throughout the forecasting period, initially falling as snow above 750, later above 500 metres. Very strong to gale force winds will be East-South-Easterly overnight, backing East from dawn.

Comments

A return to colder temperatures with the freezing level dropping to around 500 metres on Wednesday and then dropping further towards the end of the week. The snowpack in wind exposed area will be firm.
