



Avalanche Hazard Forecast

Areas of windslab will be found in wind sheltered locations mainly on South-West through West to North aspects above 900 metres. Although not particularly extensive or deep, these areas will not be well bonded. On other aspects the snowpack will be firm, icy and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Turning colder with the freezing dropping to 400 metres. After a few overnight snow showers it will generally be dry. Easterly winds will back to the North-East and ease.

Comments

Firm snow creating slip hazard in areas exposed to the strong winds of late.
