

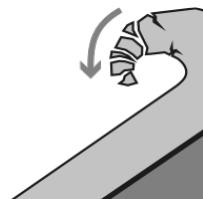




Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised moderately to weakly bonded windslab will persist in steeper wind sheltered locations on West through North to North-East aspects above 900 metres. Gully tops, steep scarp slopes and around corrie rims will be worst affected. Localised areas of moderately bonded snow will be encountered below this altitude and occasionally on wind sheltered South-West and East aspects. Exposed slopes will be scoured and icy. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Dry overnight and through most of the day, with very light snowfall arriving by mid-afternoon. Moderate North-North-Westerly winds overnight, will steadily increase to strong by the end of the period. Freezing level generally around 600 metres, with a brief rise to 700 metres, then lowering to 400 metres by late afternoon.

Comments

Firm and icy conditions underfoot. Crampons required to make safe and efficient progress on wind exposed slopes.
