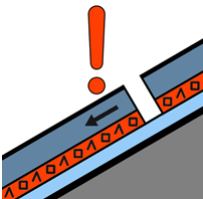

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Saturday 21/02/2026

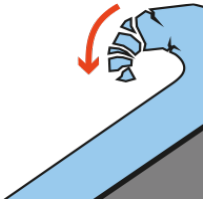

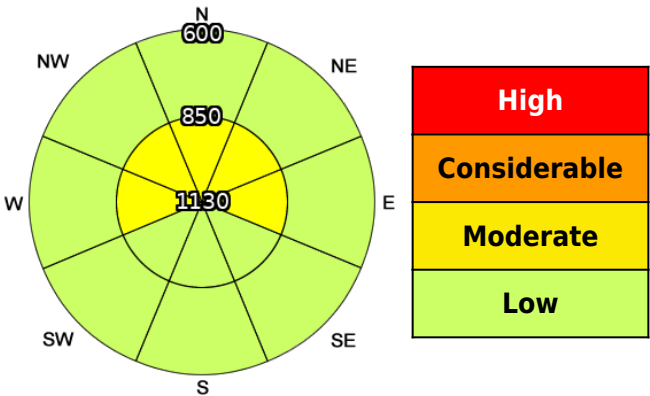

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack is slowly consolidating, however instabilities will still exist mainly on West through North to East aspects above 850 metres. Areas most affected will be steep terrain such as gullies and coire headwalls. Cornices will be unstable and liable to collapse. The snowpack will be thawing and there will be significant snow loss, particularly at lower elevations. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Showers overnight, falling as snow only on the highest summits. A drier morning will follow before the onset of persistent rain at all levels, as the freezing level rises to well above the summits. Very strong winds through Friday night, decreasing to become strong, generally from a South-Westerly direction.

Comments

Potential for cornice collapse along with ice and rockfall from the cliffs during the mild temperatures and persistent rain.
