



**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Sunday 22/02/2026**

**Avalanche Problems**

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

The existing snowpack will continue to consolidate and stability will be good. The snow surface will begin to refreeze above around 1000 metres with a continued thaw at lower elevations. Any new wet snow deposits above 1000 metres are expected to be shallow and reasonably well bonded. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

Occasional showers through the day are forecast to fall as snow above around 1000 metres. The freezing level will be above all summits overnight falling to be around 1000 metres during the day with strong South-Westerly winds.

**Comments**

Sone variation in forecast snowfall amounts, however given the relatively high freezing level any new snow deposits should be reasonably well bonded.
