



**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Wednesday 04/03/2026**

**Avalanche Problems**

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

The snowpack will remain well bonded and stable. Fresh snow accumulations on the highest summits are expected to be sleet or wet snow and have good stability, deposits are not expected to be significant. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

South-South-Easterly winds increase overnight to become very strong during the day. After a dry night precipitation during the day will fall as snow above 1250 metres. The freezing level will rise to above the summits around dawn.

**Comments**

The snowpack will be very firm overnight and in the morning with only a little softening expected during the day. Cornice collapse a possibility in daytime rain.
