

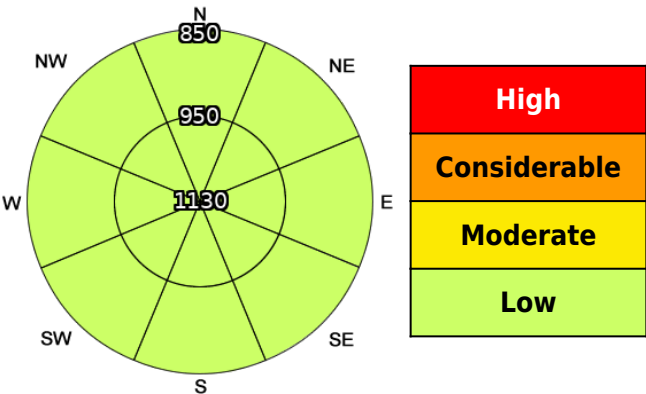

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 05/03/2026

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Overnight the snowpack will be thawing at all elevations and any remaining cornices will be weak and prone to collapse. Although fresh snow amounts are not expected to be significant, there is potential for isolated deposits of windslab developing as the freezing level drops during the afternoon. These will be confined to wind-sheltered locations on North-East to South-East aspects above 950 metres. Elsewhere the snowpack will become firm and be stable. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Rain overnight with the freezing level above the summits. Rain will gradually turn to snow throughout the afternoon as the freezing level drops to around 800 metres. Gale force Southerly winds will ease through the day to become moderate while veering West-North-West.

Comments

Thaw continues overnight with further icefall from the cliffs expected. Old snowpack will become firm during the day as the freezing level drops.
