

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New fresh unstable windslab will develop mainly on North to East to aspects above 800 metres. Minor amounts may also be encountered on both North-West and South-East aspect due to cross loading. Steep wind sheltered locations such as coire rims and gully tops will be most affected, particularly where accumulations develop over old snow. Cornice stability will remain poor. Old snow will become very firm and icy. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Precipitation is forecast throughout, heaviest overnight when the freezing level will be just above the summits. By day the freezing level will drop with snowfall easing but falling to around 600 metres. Storm force winds overnight easing to strong gale force.

Comments

A poor day on the hill is expected. Old snow will be very firm and icy.
