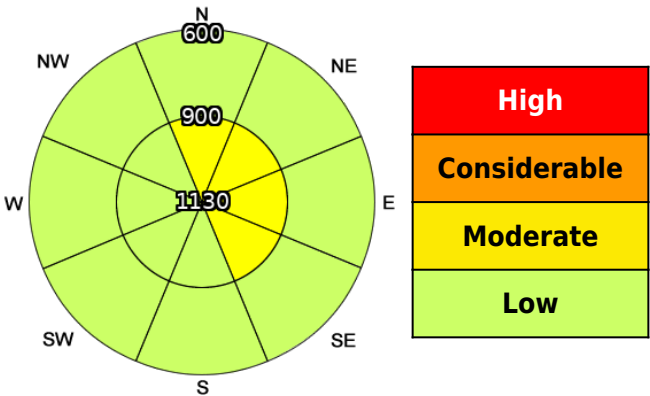
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The old snowpack that is largely confined to North-West through North to North-Easterly aspects above 800 metres will be stable throughout. Some new accumulations of snow will begin to form windslab and gradually build during the day, mostly above 900 metres on Northerly through East to South-Easterly aspects. Coire rims and gully tops most affected. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Winds storm force South-Westerly overnight gradually lessening and veering Westerly during the afternoon but still remaining strong through the forecast period. Precipitation falling as rain at all levels overnight, then turning to snow by early morning lying mostly above 800m. Freezing level above the summits overnight lowering to around 600m in the afternoon.
