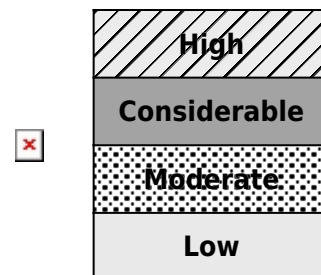

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised accumulations of poorly bonded windslab will be present in wind sheltered locations on North-East to South-East aspects above 900 metres. Gully tops and corrie rims will be most affected. Moderately bonded deposits will be present on North and some South aspects above 900 metres. Cornices will be prone to collapse. Elsewhere, there will be a slow thaw and stability will be generally good. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Mainly dry though the forecast period with fresh to strong Westerly winds. The freezing level will be initially around 900 metres, then overnight will rise above the summits and remain there throughout the day.

Comments

Continuing unsettled for the next few days with freeze thaw conditions on the summits.
