

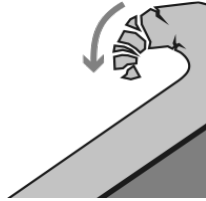

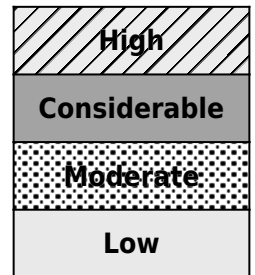
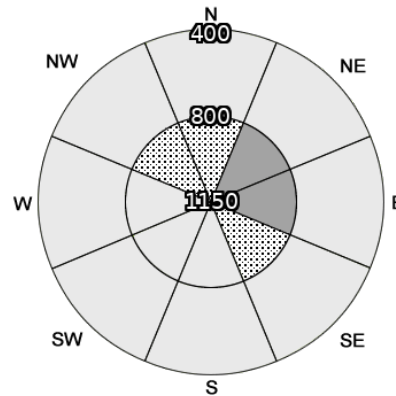
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Instabilities in poorly bonded windslab will exist with further deposits becoming more widespread in the strong winds. Unstable accumulations in wind sheltered terrain mainly above 800 metres particularly in sheltered gullies and on steep slopes with a N, NE, E and SE aspect. Fragile cornices will exist above similar aspects. Cross loading may affect other wind sheltered locations. Wind exposed slopes will be firm and often icy with better stability. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Saturday night, the freezing level will briefly rise above the summits then rapidly fall to be around 500 metres for the rest of the period. Initially some overnight rain followed by snow showers through the day. The Southerly winds will reach storm force Saturday night before veering Westerly easing but remaining strong through the day.

Comments

A stormy period during Saturday night with snowpack instabilities quickly developing.
